ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Primary function: Assist the Camp Director with the coaching of the staff

- Serve as Alternate Director in the absence of Camp Director
- Assist the Camp Director in creating and implementing a strong Staff Training program.
- Assist the head counselor with camper behavioral issues and staff matters.
- At least 25 years old
- Serve as lead coordinator for Counselor in Training (CIT) Program
- Previous experience in staff supervision & training
- Current First Aid & CPR for the Professional Rescuer

PROGRAMING DIRECTOR

Primary function: create and implement the daily evening program

- Serve as Alternate Director as requested
- Coordinate with Program Area Directors to ensure that they have creative, fresh lesson plans laid out for the week.
- Establish deadlines for program descriptions and materials, and hold the team accountable
- Disseminate information about weekly programming to staff in a timely fashion
- Oversee weekly activity sign-up process

HEAD COUNSELOR

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Primary function: serve as immediate supervisor of cabin counselors

- Serve as an Alternate Director when necessary
- Formulate community & staffing schedules
- Oversee and monitor cabin cleaning with campers/staff
- At least 21 years old
- Serve as co-coordinator for Counselor in Training (CIT) Program
- Previous experience in staff supervision & training
- Aid and coach the Cabin Counselors in dealing with behavioral issues as they arise, and offer constant training and reinforcement/techniques for counselors at staff meetings.
- Current First Aid & CPR for the Professional Rescuer

✤ AREA DIRECTOR – WATERFRONT DIRECTOR

Primary function: plan & implement activities within the Waterfront program area and supervise Lifeguards; collectively responsible for planning special events.

- At least 21 years old
- Significant experience in camping, nature, science, and outdoor skills.
- Passion for aquatic activities and a desire to create new, exciting programming
- Oversee the maintenance of waterfront equipment and facilities
- Previous experience in staff supervision desirable
- Must be certified in Am. Red Cross Lifeguard Training, First Aid & CPR, Fundamentals of Canoeing and Waterfront safety or equivalent

✤ AREA DIRECTOR – WILDERNESS DIRECTOR

Primary function: plan & implement activities within the Wilderness program area and supervise cabin staff assigned to activity area; collectively responsible for planning special events

- Passion for the Outdoors/Wilderness, and a desire to create new, exciting programming
- Oversee all outdoor areas, Lower Camp Pavilion, trails, ropes course, and campsites

- Must be willing to be certified to the Ropes Course and the Archery Range
- Must be willing to act as Cabin Counselor when necessary

✤ AREA DIRECTOR – PERFORMING ARTS DIRECTOR

Primary function: plan & implement activities within the Performing Arts Program area and supervise cabin staff assigned to the activity area; collectively responsible for planning special events

- At least 19 years old
- Significant experience in a specific area of Performing Arts Including: Music, Dance, or Theatre Arts
- Ability to play a musical instrument and lead songs
- Oversee all areas of the performance spaces
- Oversee FOTA or NEW celebration program
- Previous experience in staff supervision desirable
- Must be willing to act as Cabin Counselors when necessary

PROGRAM STAFF – ARTS & CRAFTS DIRECTOR

Primary function: plan & implement activities within the Arts and Crafts program area and supervise cabin staff assigned to activity area; collectively responsible for planning special events

- Significant experience in Visual Arts Including painting, modeling, and other crafts
- Ability to identify staff strengths and design new activities to use talents
- Oversee all areas used for Sports activities, and all equipment

PROGRAM STAFF – SPORTS DIRECTOR

Primary function: plan & implement activities within the Sports program area and supervise cabin staff assigned to activity area; collectively responsible for planning special events

- Previous experience in staff supervision desirable

CABIN COUNSELORS

Primary function: Supervise campers living in cabins and teach activities in assigned program areas – *Musical Skills Welcome*. Cabin Counselors are the most important members of the Camp Washington team, being regularly engaged with our campers on a personal level and developing strong and healthy relationships with them on a regular basis.

- Previous experience working with children & teens desirable
- Willing to provide and receive open, honest feedback with supervisors and co-workers. (Certified Lifeguards are especially welcome to apply)

✤ MEDIA SPECIALIST CABIN COUNSELOR

Primary function: To take photo and video of campers throughout the camp sessions and create a media package at the end of each session.

- At least 18 years old
- Work with Camp Director to create social media posts throughout the summer
- Catalog and archive all media by week/session/ and season
- Will have same responsibilities and expectations as a cabin counselor
- Knowledge of Photo and Video editing software desirable

REGISTERED NURSE

Primary function: Provide routine and emergency medical care to campers and staff.

- Current RN licensed in Connecticut required
- o Administer medications to campers and staff as needed
- Record all medications and medical care given to campers and staff in the Camp Health Record Logs
- Maintain adequate medical supplies and clear any necessary orders through the Director of Operations
- Administer medical attention and care to campers and staff that need to stay for an extended period in the infirmary
- Keep the infirmary disinfected and organized
- Current certification in American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer or American Heart Association CPR for Healthcare Providers
